Have your say on new statues of some of our historical local heroes (Dr Alfred Salter and Ada Salter) – please let us know what you think by completing the questionnaire inside this leaflet

In 1897 Ada (Brown) moved into Bermondsey to fight against the appalling poverty afflicting girls and women. In 1898, Alfred Salter also took up residence, deciding to sacrifice a brilliant career as a doctor at Guy's Hospital to tend the poor in the Bermondsey slums. The couple vowed to dedicate their lives to Bermondsey and married in 1900. Ada became the first woman councillor in London and the first woman mayor. Alfred became MP, first in 1922, lost the seat in 1923, regained it in 1924 and continued as the MP until 1945. His medical innovations, providing many services for free, created in Bermondsey an 'NHS before the NHS'. Ada's environmental innovations included a Beautification Committee that covered Bermondsey in trees and flowers. Together they pushed for model housing. The Salter houses can still be seen in Wilson Grove, just off the Thames Path. As Quakers, they campaigned for world peace and opposed all war. Tragically, residence in Bermondsey led to the death from scarlet fever of the Salter's only child, Joyce, aged eight, in 1910.

Since the statue of Dr Salter was stolen in November 2011 Joyce and the cat were put safely in storage and a community group has been regularly meeting with the initial remit to recover the statue. Sadly this was not achieved, and we are now planning a replacement. We plan to fundraise £100, 000 which would cover the cost of both the statues of Alfred and Ada and possibly Joyce and the cat, and any installations such as CCTV to enhance their security.

Our task now is to get your views. The results will inform the ultimate Council decision. The issues are complex and so we have added an explanation to help you decide.


C. Potential sites

By applying various criteria, the group has shortlisted eight sites from those originally suggested. No site is perfect and some may not be known to everyone.

Sites considered and rejected included Bermondsey station (statues would be behind ticket barriers), Spa Gardens and Tanner Street park (lack of security), Paterson park (no site large enough for four statues), Long Lane (narrow footpaths and lack of footfall), Cherry Gardens (past vandalism issues and local opposition), London Bridge river walkway – many potential sites already have artwork

The criteria considered were:

- A There is existing surveillance with lighting and CCTV already in place or can be added to site
- B Historic relevance (relating to the parliamentary constituency of Dr Salter, the ward and London County Council constituencies for Ada Salter, the areas associated with their work and where they lived)
- C | High footfall ie many people will see the sculptures at this site
- **D** Visual considerations of site the sculptures would "fit" the setting and would be suitable for all four statues (Dr and Ada Salter, Joyce and cat)



- 1 = St James Churchyard (both funerals of Alfred and Ada Salter were held here)
- 2 = Southwark Park (Ada Salter Memorial Gardens)
- 3 = Bermondsey Wall East (by Angel pub) near Wilson Grove Salter houses
- 4 = Canada Water (plaza in front of new library)
- 5 = Jamaica Road plaza near Dr Salter's original surgery
- 6 = St Mary Magdalen Churchyard in Dr Salter's parliamentary constituency
- 7 = Bermondsey Square in Dr Salter's parliamentary constituency
- 8 = Tooley Street the Salters built a play ground for local children in the street
